Why we collect information about you?	As a consequence of an unauthorised deposit of controlled waste/leaving litter/dog fouling resulting in committing a criminal offence		
What is the legal basis for us collecting your information?	As authorised officers we have a statutory duty to investigate offences under public health and environmental legislation such as the Environmental Protection Act 1990/Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996/Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005		
What information do we collect about you?	Name, address, contact details, DoB, gender, vehicle keeper information, data captured by police (Unifi), previous criminal convictions, Land Registry details, Council Tax details and any other relevant information to inform our investigations and legal proceedings.		
Who do we share the information with?	This is for Council use only. However if any information about the subject arises during any investigation we may be required to share data with police, Environment Agency or other regulatory services with a statutory enforcement function.		
Is any information transferred to or stored in servers based outside the European Economic Area?	No		
How long do we keep your information?	For a period of 6 years following a conclusion to any various formal enforcement options have been completed		
Who do we collect information from?	The subjects involved in committing the offence, DVLA, Police, Land Registry, regulatory partners and any other relevant services that may hold information to assist the investigation.		
What are the consequences if we don't collect the data?	If the information is not collected by the investigating officer(s) the Council would not be able to carry out its statutory functions by following all reasonable lines of enquiry putting enforcement cases at risk.
