Condition 3

All works of external repair, restoration and replacement shall exactly match the original features.

Reason

To safeguard the character and appearance of this building of special architectural or historical interest.

Note 1

Note 2

Your attention is drawn to the Party Wall Act 1996. The Act will apply where work is to be carried out on the following:

- Excavating near a neighbouring building

The legal requirements of this Act lies with the building/ site owner, they must find out whether the works subject of this planning permission falls within the terms of the Party Wall Act 1996. There are no requirements or duty on the part of the local authority in such matters.
