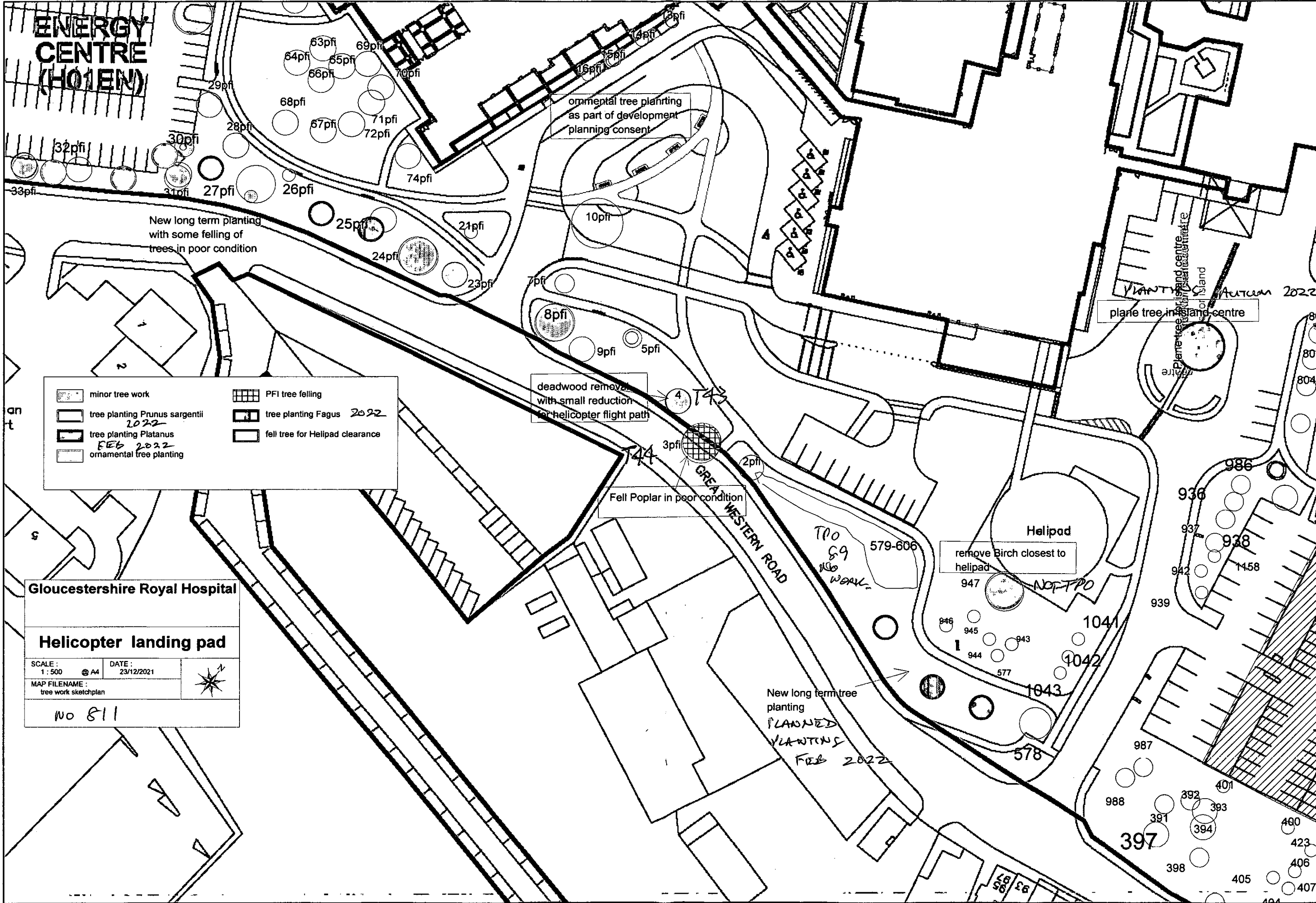

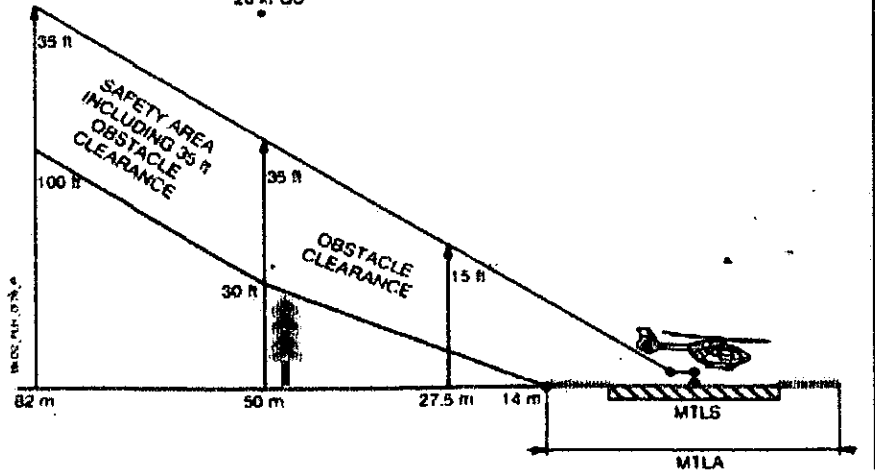


Fig. C2 Landing flight path obstacle clearance

All trees in line with the landing strip must be below those heights. In regards to the trees on the west side of the pad the MTLA would be the H mark so you have a 50 ish metre headstart there!

Any trees to the side of the pad we request that they are faced as far back as is reasonably practicable. The tree area is considered part of the MTLA where the aircraft could be expected to land in during an emergency (eg: steering away from the ED) so the trees need to give as much room as possible to avoid blade strikes.
